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FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

Mary, Queen of Peace

Peace is what all like to have but seldom one can claim that his/her life is always peaceful. The things that can disturb our peace can be inside us or outside. Peace is either 'freedom from disturbance' or 'a state or period in which there is no war or war has ended.' According to Cambridge Dictionary, 'peace is freedom from war and violence, especially when people live and work together happily'. This indicates that there are two important aspects to peace — one is 'absence of war or violence' and the other is 'happy life'.

When the Risen Lord appeared to the twelve disciples he breathed his spirit into them and said "Peace be with you." The disciples were facing a violent situation that disturbed them—the crucifixion and death of their master. They could not live happily because of this.



Mary, the Mother of Jesus was with them consoling and giving assurance. She prays to the Risen Lord to help them to be redeemed from this terrible situation. She becomes the mediator for peace from God. The intercession of Mary is tremendous. Jesus knowing the plight of his disciples gives them the grace of peace through the outpouring of his Spirit.
